



SUPPLY LIST

- Students will need a reference to work from for a duration of time. A photographic reference will be fine to use in lieu of a model. Each student should have a photo of a dramatically lit subject, where the lighting gives a heightened sense of form. Using a single light source is ideal for this- here is a link to a description of Rembrandt lighting, which would be a good model to follow: https://expertphotography.com/rembrandt-lighting-photography/. Students could use a regular light or flashlight to achieve this.
- Student may decide to use a self-portrait, or a portrait of someone else. If a good print of the image is not possible, students can work from their laptop or computer screen, or connect their phone to the TV.

OPTIONAL SUPPLIES:

- A piece of foam core larger than 18x24" to use as a drawing board
- Blue painter's tape to tape drawing paper to foam core
- o Other soft pastels- pastel pencils, charcoal pencils, white charcoal pencils
- Drop cloth to cover floor from pastel dust
- Nitrile gloves if you want to keep hands clean
- Mahl stick (or dowel rod to use as a mahl stick) to steady hand while working
- Large clips to clip drawing or foam core to sturdy backing
- Push pins to tack foam core backing to wall for working
